Pádraic Mac Coitir to Stand in Local Elections

As the countdown to the May 5 local elections continues, it has been confirmed that Lenadoon resident Pádraic MacCoitir will be running for éirigi in the Upper Falls electoral area.

As a lifelong republican with a proven track record of community activism, Pádraic has the right experience to represent the hard-pressed communities of Andersonstown, Lenadoon and the rest of the Upper Falls.

éirigi's decision to contest the election was taken in the context of the deteriorating economic situation and the savage cutbacks being implemented by the Stormont regime. Unfortunately, there is nothing new about the current state of affairs. For as long as anyone can remember, West Belfast has been crippled by unemployment, discrimination and deprivation. The residents of this proud community have always been treated as suspect second class citizens by the British state, its police force and the Stormont regime.

Despite all the hype of the last 15 years, there has been no 'new dawn' for West Belfast. Virtually all of the wealth generated by the 'peace dividend' has ended up elsewhere. Now, the public services that we all rely on in our daily lives - our schools, hospitals, libraries, public transport and a lot more are to be starved of investment by Stormont and the British government.

A Community Fight Back

Voting for Pádraic won't change the world, but it will challenge the political establishment that has failed West Belfast for decades. A vote for Pádraic will send a message that you've had enough of the tired politics and broken promises of the past and that we as a community are going to fight back against the cutbacks. Pádraic MacCoitir

Pádraic MacCoitir is a 53-year-old native of Andersonstown and long-time Lenadoon resident.

Joining the republican struggle in 1970, Pádraic has been imprisoned on four separate occasions for his republican activities, spending a total of 15 years in captivity. Between July 1976 and 1979, he took part in the blanket and no wash protests for political status in the H-Blocks of Long Kesh.

Since being released from prison in 1996, Pádraic has been heavily involved in socialist republican and community politics, including working with the large political ex-prisoner population in West Belfast. He is an active trade unionist, a former chairperson of the National Graves Association, an Irish language enthusiast and a keen follower of Gaelic sports. Pádraic is also a founding member of the Turais political tour-guide company that aims to give visitors to West Belfast an accurate recount of the conflict. Over the coming months and years éirígí and Pádraic are committed to:

- Fighting the Stormont cutbacks to healthcare, education and other vital public services.
- Rebuilding a strong, vibrant and radical community of resistance in West Belfast.
- Working with communities to tackle the roots of crime and develop viable alternatives to the PSNI.
